FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

Some time ago, Fr. Steven Wood and I talked about having an occasional feature in the bulletin when one of us might highlight a podcast, website, book, video, movie or some other media that could help one to grow in the Catholic faith. I have mentioned from time to time a website called "The Catholic Thing" (TCT).

(www.thecatholicthing.org) TCT is overseen by Robert Royal whom you may have seen on EWTN. Mr. Royal and Fr. Gerald Murray form the "papal posse" which appears from time to time on Raymond Arroyo's Thursday evening show called "The World Over Live". I receive an article every morning from TCT in my email. I do not always read the contribution, but I have found that when I do read one of the articles, I usually learn something I didn't already know. Recently, I read an article by Fr. Jerry Pokorsky. Fr. Pokorsky is a priest of the Diocese of Arlington (Virginia) whom I had seen in mid-October when I was in that part of country for a Natural Family Planning Symposium organized by the U.S. Bishops' Conference. I don't know Fr. Pokorsky very well, but I know him well enough to know that he has a wicked sense of humor. When I met up with him in October, the occasion was a dinner gathering of 7 or 8 Arlington priests at a priest friend's rectory in McLean, VA. At one point during the dinner, Fr. Pokorsky and another priest were taking turns telling jokes that were keeping us quite entertained. I've always admired a good (and, yes, clean) joke teller, because I can't remember jokes very well at all.

Anyway, let's talk about Fr. Pokorsky's December 4th article from the TCT. The article is entitled: "Appropriating the Christmas Appropriators" and the main premise is that we live at a time when there is a tendency to scrub out of our culture anything that might be remotely Christian. Fr. Pokorsky makes the important point that it does not seem right that atheists make money off of Christmas and then turn around and label Christians as intolerant. He writes (ironically): "I have no problem with atheists making an honest buck off Christmas. But when an atheistic culture cashes in on Jesus while impugning His followers as intolerant and hateful, it's time to rise up and, well, claim victim status."

Fr. Pokorsky lists some examples of Christian-themed elements of Christmas whose true meaning have been obscured by our secular culture:

1. Christmas tree: With its evergreen leaves, the Christmas tree points to Jesus who gives us everlasting life. Moreover, the Christmas tree reminds Christians of Christ on the cross who was nailed to the wood of a tree.
2. Christmas wreath: The circular wreath symbolizes God, the Beginning and End of all things.
3. Holly: With its pointy leaves, holly symbolizes the

the crown of thorns that Jesus wore during his Passion. The berries represent the drops of blood from our Lord as He made His way to the cross.

4. Christmas lights and candles: Our Christmas lights point to Christ, our light.
5. Christmas tree star: The star reminds us of the star that guided the magi to the location of the Holy Family.
6. Candy canes: These sweet candies remind us of the staff carried by the shepherds who were among the first witnesses of the newborn King.

I refer you to Fr. Pokorsky's article for the rest of the examples he gives.

While Father's article is somewhat tongue-in-cheek, he concludes with some very good advice:

In the meantime, during Advent, Christians may continue to prepare for our Savior's birthday with a good Confession and light penitential practices: "Prepare the way of the Lord, [and] make his paths straight." (Lk. 3:4) Amidst a harsh, barren, intolerant, and ugly culture, let's adorn the sanctuaries of our churches and homes with the symbols of Christmas: twinkling lights, evergreens, candy, and gifts – the reminders of Jesus and the sweetness of the Gospels. On Christmas Day, let's gather around the decorated Christmas tree and the Nativity Scene and sing hymns of peace and joy. *O Little Town of Bethlehem. Silent Night. Hark! The Herald Angels Sing.* At need, even throw in the Elvis Christmas album for good measure.

Amen brother! Blessed Advent to you all!

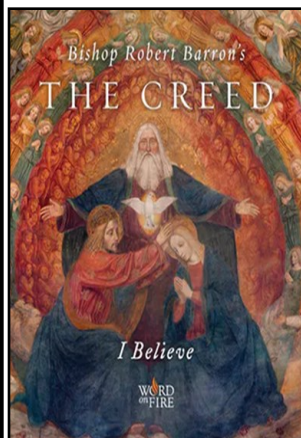

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María,

Hace algún tiempo, el Padre Steven Wood y yo hablamos sobre ocasionalmente presentar algo en el boletín, cuando uno de nosotros recalcaríamos un podcast, sitio web, libro, video, película o algún otro medio el cual nos pueda ayudar a crecer en la fe católica. He mencionado de vez en cuando un sitio web llamado "The Catholic Thing" (TCT). (www.thecatholicthing.org) TCT es supervisado por Robert Royal, a quien pueden haber visto en EWTN. El Sr. Royal y el Padre Gerald Murray forman el "posse papal" el cual sale de vez en cuando en el programa de los jueves por la noche de Raymond Arroyo llamado "The World Over Live". Recibo un artículo todas las mañanas de TCT en mi correo electrónico. No siempre leo la contribución, pero he descubierto que cuando leo uno de los artículos, generalmente aprendo algo que aún no sabía. Recientemente, leí un artículo del Padre Jerry Pokorsky. El Padre Pokorsky es un sacerdote de la Diócesis de Arlington (Virginia) a quien había visto a mediados de octubre cuando estaba en esa parte del país para un Simposio de Planificación Familiar Natural organizado por la Conferencia Episcopal de los Estados Unidos. No conozco muy bien al Padre Pokorsky, pero lo conozco lo suficientemente bien como para saber que tiene un sentido del humor pícaro. Cuando me reuní con él en octubre, la ocasión fue una cena de unos 7 u 8 sacerdotes de Arlington en la rectoría de un amigo sacerdote en McLean, VA. En un momento de la cena, el Padre Pokorsky y otro sacerdote se turnaban para contar chistes que nos mantenían bastante entretenidos. Siempre he admirado a un buen (y, sí, limpio) narrador de chistes, porque yo no puedo recordar los chistes en lo absoluto.

Bueno, hablemos del artículo del Padre Pokorsky del 4 de diciembre de TCT. El artículo se titula: "Apropiarse de los Apropiadores de Navidad" y la premisa principal es que vivimos en un momento en que hay una tendencia a eliminar de nuestra cultura cualquier cosa que pueda ser remotamente cristiana. El Padre Pokorsky señala que no parece correcto que los ateos hagan dinero con la Navidad y luego se den la vuelta y etiqueten a los cristianos como intolerantes. Él escribe (irónicamente): "No tengo ningún problema con que los ateos ganen dinero honesto con la Navidad. Pero cuando una cultura atea saca provecho de Jesús mientras impugna a sus seguidores como intolerantes y odiosos, es hora de levantarse y, bueno, reclamar el estatus de víctima".

El Padre Pokorsky enumera algunos ejemplos de

elementos de la Navidad de temática cristiana cuyo verdadero significado ha sido oscurecido por nuestra cultura secular:

1. Árbol Navideño: Con sus ramas de hoja perenne, el árbol de Navidad señala a Jesús que nos da vida eterna. Además, el árbol de Navidad recuerda a los cristianos de Cristo en la cruz que fue clavado en la madera de un árbol.
2. Corona Navideña: La corona circular simboliza a Dios, el Principio y el Fin de todas las cosas.
3. Encino: Con sus hojas puntiagudas, el encino simboliza la corona de espinas que Jesús usó durante su Pasión. Las bayas representan las gotas de sangre de nuestro Señor mientras Él se dirigía a la cruz.
4. Luces y velas Navideñas: Nuestras luces de Navidad apuntan a Cristo, nuestra luz.
5. Estrella del árbol Navideño: La estrella nos recuerda a la estrella que guía a los reyes magos a la ubicación de la Sagrada Familia.
6. Bastones de menta: Estos dulces caramelos nos recuerdan el bastón que llevaban los pastores que estuvieron entre los primeros testigos del Rey recién nacido.

Les remito al artículo del Padre Pokorsky para el resto de los ejemplos que da.

Si bien el artículo del padre es algo irónico, concluye con algunos consejos muy buenos:

Mientras tanto, durante el Adviento, los cristianos pueden continuar preparándose para el cumpleaños de nuestro Salvador con una buena Confesión y prácticas penitenciales ligeras: "Preparen el camino del Señor, enderecen sus senderos." (Lc. 3:4) En medio de una cultura dura, estéril, intolerante y fea, adornemos los santuarios de nuestros templos y hogares con los símbolos de la Navidad: luces parpadeantes, ramas perennes, dulces y regalos: los recordatorios de Jesús y la dulzura de los Evangelios. El día de Navidad, reunamos alrededor del árbol de Navidad decorado y el Nacimiento y cantemos himnos de paz y alegría... si es necesario, incluso agregue el álbum Navideño de Elvis.

¡Amén hermano! ¡Bendito Adviento a todos ustedes!
